

Below is an example of the course numberings you will see in the schedule along with explanations of the various formats. Please reference this when deciding on the type of courses you wish to enroll in each semester. If you have any questions, feel free to make an appointment with an advisor. Note about Days of the Week: M – Monday, T – Tuesday, W – Wednesday, R – Thursday, F – Friday

Section I: Face-to-Face Courses: All class meetings will take place in-person.

Example: ENGL 1301.0001 Composition I MTWR 8:00 – 9:50

This section only uses numbers.

Section II: Hybrid Courses: Half of the class meetings are in-person, while the other half of class meetings are completed on-line at your convenience while meeting specified due dates set by the instructor.

Example: HIST 1301.0H01 US History I MW 8:30 – 9:50

Look for the “H” in the section number.

Section III: Remote Courses: Class will meet live (synchronously) online only through Zoom or Teams during the specified days/times. You must have a web cam, microphone, and stable internet connection.

Example: GOVT 2305.0R01 US Government MTWR 10:00 – 11:20

Look for the “R” in the section number.

Section IV: HyFlex Courses: The student has the option to decide whether to attend each class meeting in-person on campus OR live (synchronously) through Zoom or Teams during the specified days/times. For synchronous attendance, you must have a web cam, microphone, and stable internet connection. In some classes, you have the flexibility to complete course work outside of normal class time (asynchronously) typically via Blackboard. You should communicate with your instructor regarding any of the attendance options.

Example: MATH 1314.0X01 College Algebra TR 8:30 – 9:50

Look for the “X” in the section number.

Section V: Web Courses: All course work is done at the student’s convenience using Blackboard, while meeting due dates set by the instructor.

Example: PSYC 2314.0W01 Human Growth & Development Web

Look for the “W” in the section number.

Section VI: Night Classes and UT-Tyler Longview Courses:

- If a section number is in the thirties, MATH 1314.0031, class is at night in Kilgore.
- If a section number is in the forties, MATH 1314.0041, class is during the day at KC-Longview.

- c) If a section number is in the fifties, MATH 1314.0051, class is at night at KC-Longview.
- d) If a section number has a T in it, MATH 1314.TH50, class is at UT-Tyler Longview Center.

Section VII: Course Code for Courses that has Labs with Hyflex, Web, Remote, and Hybrid Combinations:

Example: BIOL 2402.WX01 Anatomy and Physiology II Web
 Anatomy and Physiology II TR 10:00 – 11:50

This section includes two types of class formats. The first letter shows the lecture type—“W” means the lecture is fully online. The second letter refers to the lab type—“X” means the lab is HyFlex, so you can attend either in person or online.

Example: BIOL 2420.RH01 Micro Biology Non-Sci Maj MW 8:30 – 9:50
 Micro Biology Non-Sci Maj TR 10:00 – 11:50

This section includes two types of class formats. The first letter refers to the lecture—“R” means the lecture is remote (held online at scheduled times). The second letter refers to the lab—“H” means the lab is hybrid, with a mix of in-person and online activities.

Example: BIOL 1408.WH01 Biology Non-Sci Maj Web
 Biology Non-Sci Maj MW 8:00 – 9:50

This section includes two types of class formats. The first letter refers to the lecture—“W” means the lab is fully online. The second letter refers to the lab—“H” means the lab is hybrid, with a mix of in-person and online activities.

Example: BIOL 1407.WR01 Biology Sci Maj II Web
 Biology Sci Maj II TR 10:00 – 11:50
